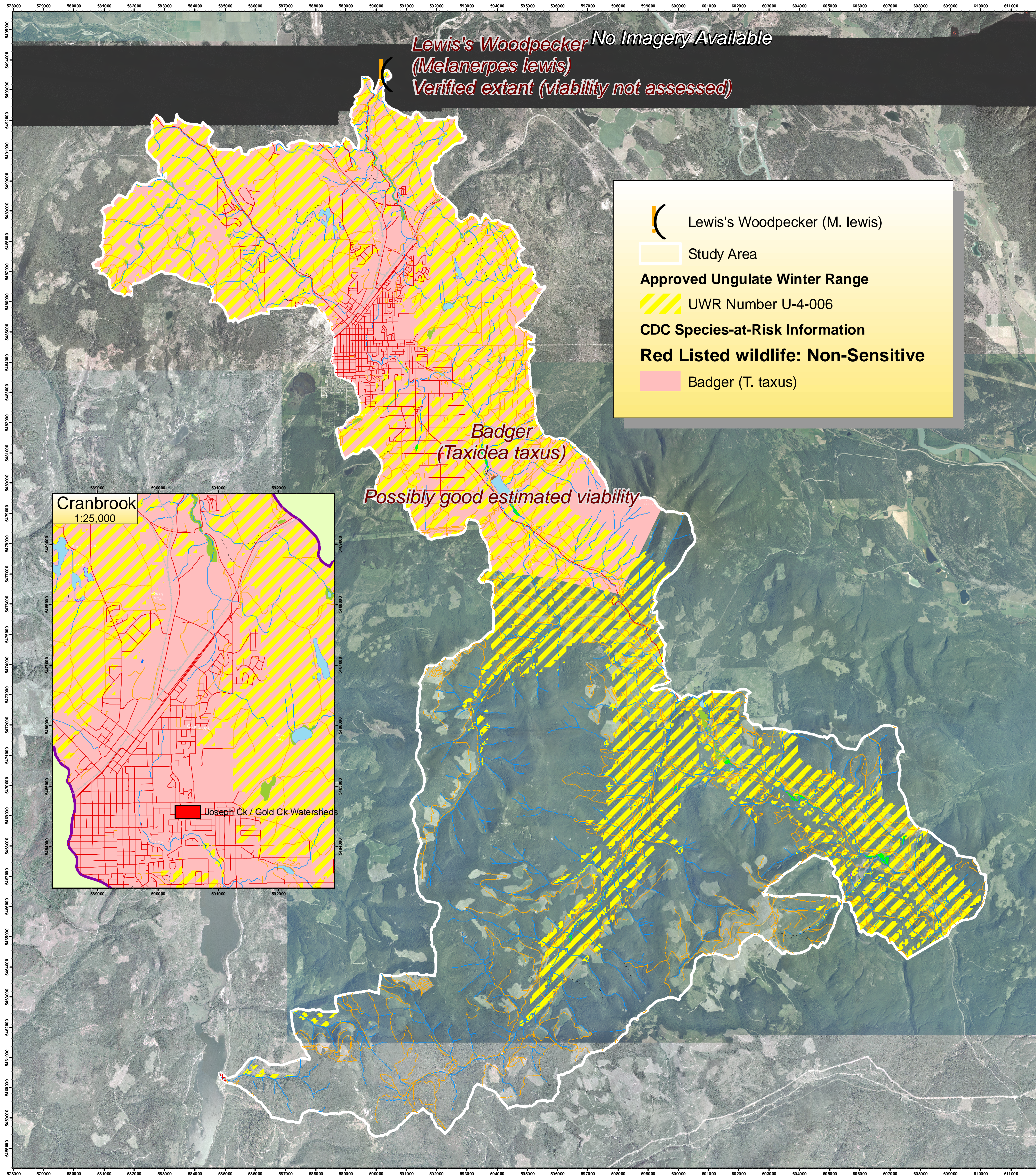


Wildlife Values in Joseph Creek and Gold Creek Watersheds

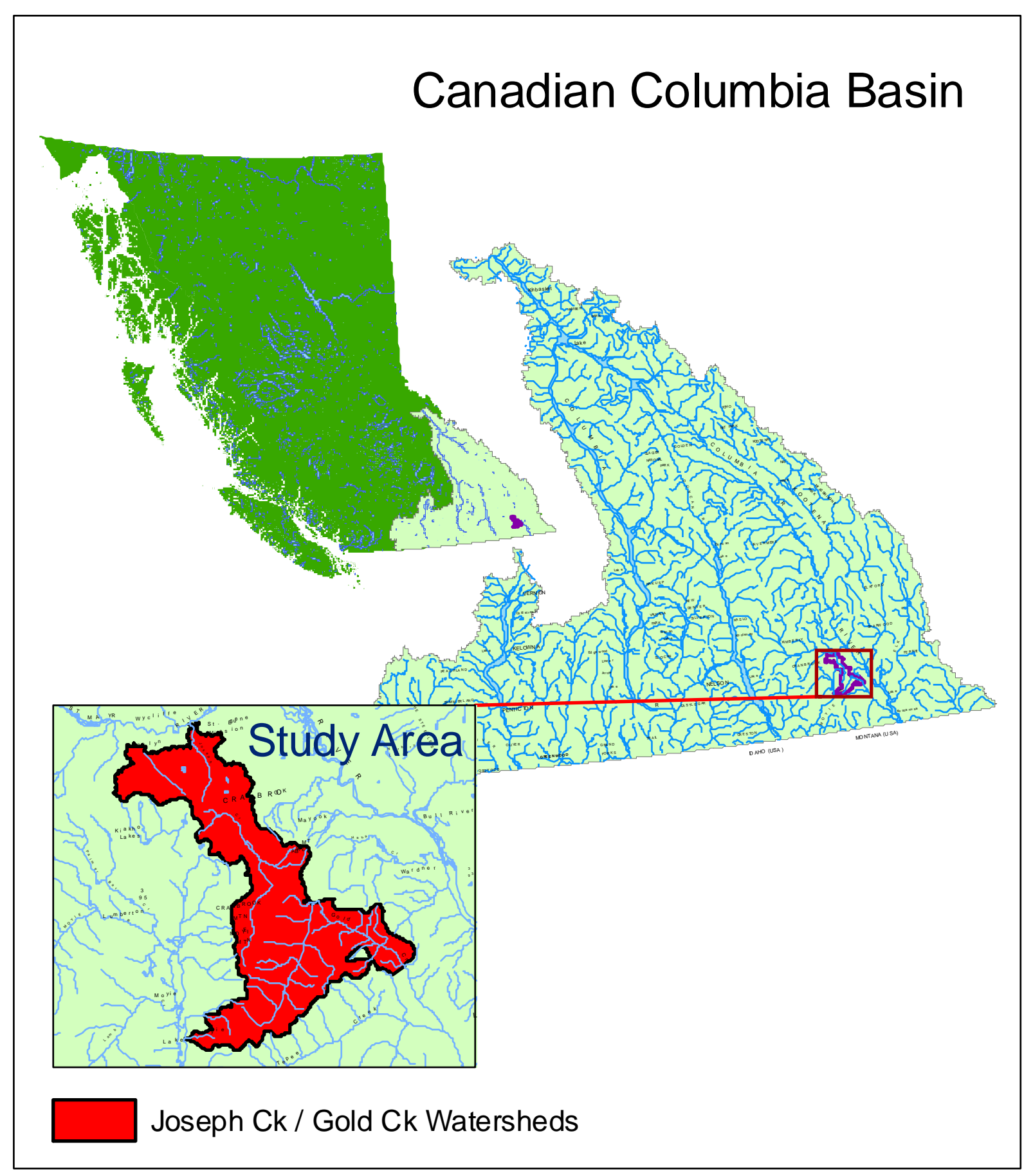
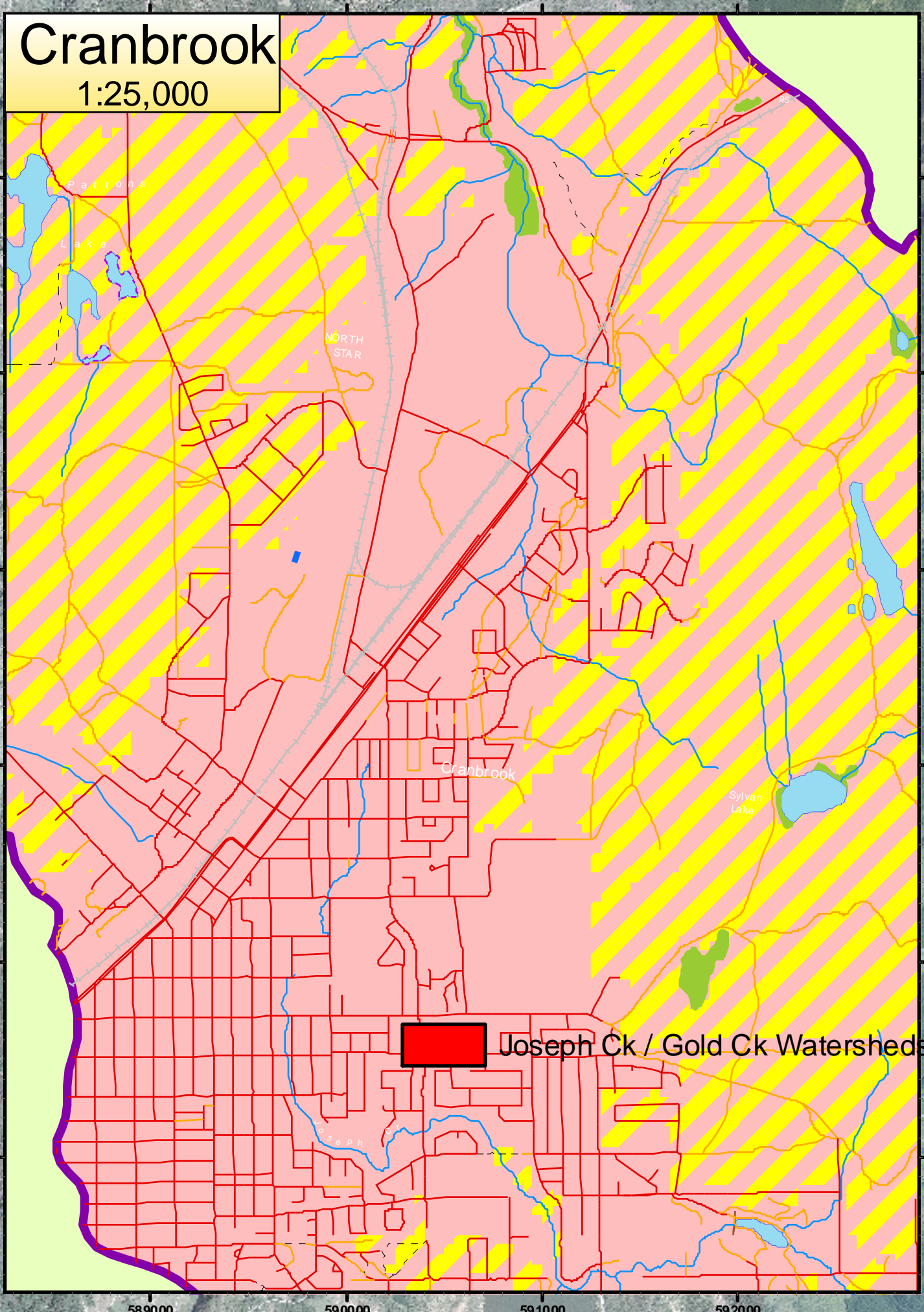

This study area comprises Joseph Creek and Gold Creek watersheds, adjacent to Cranbrook, BC. The purpose of this map is to illustrate identified Wildlife Values within the area.

The Conservation Data Centre has identified suitable habitat areas for two Red-Listed (Endangered) wildlife species within the watershed: Badger (*Taxidea taxus*), and Lewis's woodpecker (*Melanerpes lewis*).

Lowland portions of the watershed are identified as Approved Ungulate Winter Range (UWR) under the Forest and Range Practices Act. This range unit is listed for White-tailed and Mule Deer, Moose, Elk, and Bighorn Sheep.
