Issue

To create current policies and procedures for the prevention of and response to sexual violence at Selkirk College.

Areas of Concern

- 20-43% of women experience sexual assault while attending college.
- 50% of sexual assaults involve alcohol.
- In 2015 the BC government implemented Bill-23, mandating that post secondary institutions create their own sexual violence misconduct policy.
 Prior to this, institutions were not legally required to have such a policy.

Method

A 10 question survey was distributed to the Selkirk College student population, designed to obtain their thoughts, witnessed occurrences, and responses to sexualized violence. 246

Identified Themes

- Discomfort around discourse on sexual violence.
- Inability to verbalize forms of sexual violence.
- Inability to identify supports and resources available for sexual violence.
- Acceptance of rape culture beliefs (men and women).
- Student desire to have sexual violence defined, and have supports in place.
